

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Fellowship applicants are required to complete the UC Santa Barbara [e-app](#) for [admission](#) to the Bren School of Environmental Science & Management and the LAFF Application to be considered for this Fellowship. To upload your completed LAFF application to your UCSB e-app, click on the Statements & Supplemental Documents Application Section and select to "Edit Section." After you have uploaded the three required application documents (Statement of Purpose, Personal Achievements/Contributions Statement, and Resume or CV), select "Other Document Type." In the Document Title text bar, enter Latin American Fisheries Fellowship Application for its name. Click "Browse" to find and upload your completed document.
